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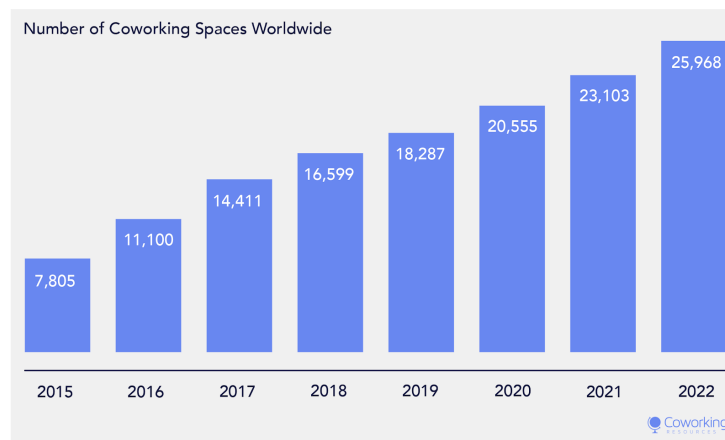

2019 GLOBAL COWORKING GROWTH STUDY

—CoworkingResources analyzed the top 50 countries with the highest density of coworking spaces compared to their population, top countries worldwide by growth per capita, and global growth by business type in one comprehensive industry overview—

[New York, New York] — 15 May 2019. [CoworkingResources](#), the leading publication reporting on the coworking industry, conducted a study on the state of the industry in 2019. According to the study, our projections show that in 2019 growth will be slower than the previous year, although the industry continues to grow at a strong pace. On a global scale, over 20,000 spaces will be operating in 2020 and over 25,000 by 2022. We have broken down these projections by business type—expansion, chain or new business. We have also provided the top countries and cities worldwide by coworking growth per capita.

Key insights of our research:

- In 2019, over 1,600 new spaces are expected to open globally.
- London is the city where coworking is growing the fastest, followed by New York City and Toronto.
- Four cities in Asia made the global top 20 list.
- At a country level, Luxembourg, Ireland and Singapore are the fastest growing markets.

Our projections are based on extensive research in which all coworking space openings have been tracked for a 10-month period, from June 2018 to April 2019. The data has been collected and categorized by following web and social media announcements, in addition to industry news.

Ashley Davis, the Managing Editor at CoworkingResources comments, *“This upward trend in individually-owned, independent, spaces shows that the larger chains may not have a monopoly on the industry as previously thought.”*

Davis adds, *“Based on our findings, we see that there is more than enough room for small, independent spaces to grow wherever there is a community and that they, in fact, may fare better in less-populated, unlikely places.”*
